

Neuropsychological/Psychological Testing – Ana Cragnolino, Ph.D.

Psychological Testing is used predominantly when clients are concerned about the emotional aspects of their problems or have identified or are trying to identify the existence of co-existing disorders such as mood and anxiety disorders, as well as PTSD, personality disorders, and self-esteem issues.

While psychological testing will often include some cognitive testing to assess general intelligence and general problems with attention, processing, reading, and analytical thinking, psychological testing will focus more exclusively on the emotional aspects of a client's problems. To assess this, I use a number of questionnaires (objective measures) as well as projective tests (such as the Rorschach).

I have specialized training in Neuropsychology. My experience is varied in that I have evaluated individuals with a number of difficulties including but not limited to attention and learning disorders and neuropsychological impairments due to medical conditions and chronic pain.
